1. Grants

Due to unexpectedly high interest in the Community Sport Infrastructure Grant this year, CPC's application for funding for lighting was not successful in the first round of allocating funds. However another tranche of funding will occur in March so we hope we might be lucky then.

The Stronger Communities Grant for the shade improvements has been approved and work will start in the near future on the northern shades re-roofing and adding drop down shades to the western side of the central shelter.

2. Ryman

Ryman aged Care have approached CPC offering some financial support but with no clear plan in mind and have invited us to consider. The feeling from meeting their staff is positive so CPC will put suggestions forward as to how Ryman could help us in return for some publicity

3. Joint Management Committee (JMC)

It was noted that the clubhouse had been left unlocked by hirers on two recent occasions. Agreed to discuss with the JMC what best can be done to avoid a recurrence. Also agreed to request a copy of the insurance covering non-club members at Lynden Park.

4. Australia Day

Agreed to have a working bee on Australia day followed by a social BBQ with all food provided by the Club and a couple of games in the afternoon. The Monkey to publicise this and get RSVPs.

5. Classic Doubles competition 3rd February

The working bee will get the pistes ready. Sue has the catering in hand. JP will be asked to run the competition.

6. The Jolly Roger

This annual friendly competition with Mt Macedon is provisionally scheduled for April 6th. To be confirmed. The event will be at their grounds this year.

7. Uniforms

Some preliminary work has been done on designing new Club uniforms. Agreed it's difficult for a committee to get this right so the Monkey will send a survey to members to help with direction.

8. Housekeeping

The gardener/weed control is now under direct CPC control and this will help keep weeds to a minimum. The dishwasher has broken again, Council to be advised.
