1. Present

7 of the 10 Committee members were present at this meeting.

2. Treasurer's Report

The end March figures showed a healthy operating balance but the commentary reminded members that this included the recently received \$2,500 grant and would reduce by \$4,000 during April after the cost of the northern shelter and central shelter shades were paid for.

3. VPC Open Doubles

Camberwell is due to host this competition on Sunday April 14th. Over 30 teams are anticipated. John Paul has agreed to handle scoring. Catering arrangements are well in hand. A very successful working bee with 22 attendees was held last week and the pistes are now in excellent condition.
